BY-LAW No. 26-2003

**To permanently close a portion of the Oak Park Avenue road allowance, abutting premises
No. 457 Oak Park Avenue.**

WHEREAS it is recommended that a portion of the Oak Park Avenue road allowance, abutting premises No. 457 Oak Park Avenue, be permanently closed as a public highway and be sold to the abutting owner upon the terms and conditions set out in Clause No. 57 of Toronto East York Community Council Report No. 7, as adopted by City of Toronto Council at its meeting held on May 21, 22 and 23, 2002; and

WHEREAS notice of the proposed by-law to permanently close the said portion of highway was published in a daily newspaper on January 6, 2003, and was posted on the notices page of the City's web site for at least the two week period immediately preceding the Toronto East York Community Council meeting held on January 21, 2003 and no one appeared to address the Toronto East York Community Council;

The Council of the City of Toronto HEREBY ENACTS as follows:

1. The portion of the Oak Park Avenue road allowance, abutting premises No. 457 Oak Park Avenue described as follows:

Part of Gresham Avenue on Plan 1770, known as the public highway Oak Park Avenue, designated as Part 1 on Plan 66R-19806 in the City of Toronto (formerly in the Borough of East York) and Province of Ontario is hereby permanently closed as a public highway.
