## **CITY OF TORONTO**

### **BY-LAW No. 268-2003**

**To amend former City of Scarborough Sign By-law No. 22980, as amended, to increase the minimum distance separation between billboards, to regulate the installation of billboards at intersections and to introduce an annual cap on new billboard permits.**

The Council of the City of Toronto HEREBY ENACTS as follows:

1. Former City of Scarborough Sign By-law No. 22980, as amended, being “A By-law to prohibit and regulate signs”, is further amended as follows:
  - A. By adding the following sentence immediately after Sentence 2.4.2(2)(a.2) of Schedule “A”:

“(a.3) A maximum of 20 new permits for the types of signs listed in Sentence 2.4.2(2)(a) shall be issued in a calendar year”.
  - B. By deleting Sentence 2.4.2(3)(e) of Schedule “A” and substituting the following sentence:

“(e) Poster panel, billboard, painted bulletin, posturn and spectacular signs or sign groups on the same side of a street shall not be located closer together than 150 metres”.
  - C. By adding the following sentence immediately after Sentence 2.4.2(3)(e) of Schedule “A”:

“(f) No part of a poster panel, billboard, painted bulletin, posturn or spectacular sign or sign group shall be located within 30 metres of an intersection, measured from the point at which two street lines intersect”.
