## CITY OF TORONTO

## BY-LAW No. 290-2003

To layout and dedicate certain land for public highway purposes between The Queensway and Sherway Gate and to name that highway Sherway Gardens Road.

WHEREAS notice of the proposed enactment of the draft by-law was advertised in a daily newspaper on March 17, 2003, was posted on the City of Toronto web site for two weeks, and interested persons were given an opportunity to be heard at a public meeting held on April 2, 2003, and it is appropriate to name the public highway between The Queensway and Sherway Gate, "Sherway Gardens Road"; and

Whereas certain land was acquired by the City in connection with an Ontario Municipal Board Decision dated October 17, 1997;

The Council of the City of Toronto HEREBY ENACTS as follows:

1. Certain land between The Queensway and Sherway Gate, described by W. Kowalenko, City Surveyor, as follows, namely:

Part of Lot 11, Concession 3, Colonel Smith's Tract, designated as PARTS 25, 27, 28 and 30 on Plan 64R-16731 in the Registry Division of the Toronto Registry Office (No. 66) in the City of Toronto (formerly the City of Etobicoke) and Province of Ontario is laid out and dedicated for public highway purposes and named Sherway Gardens Road.
