CITY OF TORONTO

BY-LAW No. 711-2003

To amend City of Toronto Municipal Code Chapter 162, Notice, Public, to decrease the notice period to a minimum of four working days.

The Council of the City of Toronto HEREBY ENACTS as follows:

1. Section 162-3A of Chapter 162, Notice, Public, of The City of Toronto Municipal Code is amended as follows:
 - A. Subsections A(1) and (3) are deleted and the following substituted:
 - “(1) The notice shall be posted on the notices page of the City’s web site for at least the minimum notice period immediately preceding the City committee meeting at which the matter will be considered and an opportunity is provided for members of the public to speak to the matter.
 - (2) For the purposes of Subsection A(1), the minimum notice period starts on the earlier of the publication of the main agenda for the City committee meeting and the fourth working day before the City committee meeting.
 - (3) A notice given under Subsection A(1) is sufficient even if there are times during the minimum notice period when the City’s Web site is not accessible”.
