CITY OF TORONTO

BY-LAW No. 137-2005

To designate the Harbord Village area as a Heritage Conservation District.

WHEREAS City Council, at its meeting of October 26, 27 and 28, 2004, adopted Clause 67 of Toronto and East York Community Council Report 8 and in so doing authorized the passing of a by-law under section 40 of the *Ontario Heritage Act* defining the Harbord Village heritage conservation district study area as an area to be examined for future designation as a heritage conservation district; and

WHEREAS City Council, at its meeting of October 26, 27 and 28, 2004, passed By-law No. 953-2004 defining the study area; and

WHEREAS a heritage study of the area was subsequently conducted;

The Council of the City of Toronto HEREBY ENACTS as follows:

- 1. The area outlined by the heavy lines shown on the map attached as Schedule "A" to this by-law is designated as a heritage conservation district under Part V of the *Ontario Heritage Act*, R.S.O. 1990, chapter O.18.
- 2. The heritage district conservation plan for the Harbord Village Heritage Conservation District area, prepared by Catherine Nasmith, dated December 23, 2004 is adopted.
- 3. A copy of the Harbord Village heritage conservation district plan is available for inspection in the offices of Heritage Preservation Services, Toronto City Hall, 100 Queen Street West.
