BY-LAW No. 160-2005

**To repeal former City of Toronto By-law No. 460-93 pertaining to the lane known as
Roy's Square.**

WHEREAS it is recommended that former City of Toronto By-law No. 460-93, being a by-law to stop up and close to vehicular traffic but not to pedestrian traffic the public lanes first south of Bloor Street East and first east of Yonge Street, known as "Roy's Square" for specified periods of time, and to authorize the erection and removal of temporary barricades to enforce the due observance thereof, be repealed at the time the bill to permanently close the public lane known as Roy's Square is introduced in Council; and

WHEREAS on February 3, 2005, City Council enacted By-law No. 47-2005, being a by-law to permanently close the public lane known as Roy's Square, extending easterly from Yonge Street, then northerly to Bloor Street East;

The Council of the City of Toronto HEREBY ENACTS as follows:

1. Former City of Toronto By-law No. 460-93, being a by-law to stop up and close to vehicular traffic but not to pedestrian traffic the public lanes first south of Bloor Street East and first east of Yonge Street, known as "Roy's Square" for specified periods of time, and to authorize the erection and removal of temporary barricades to enforce the due observance thereof, is hereby repealed.
