CITY OF TORONTO

BY-LAW No. 513-2005

To amend City of Toronto Municipal Code Chapter 545, Licensing, respecting the renewal of licences.

WHEREAS Section 150 of the *Municipal Act*, 2001 grants municipalities the authority to license, regulate and govern any business wholly or partly carried on within the municipality for purposes of health and safety, consumer protection and/or nuisance control; and

WHEREAS the City of Toronto moved licence renewals from a system of common renewal dates for each licence category to a system of renewal dates on the anniversary date of the issuance each individual licence, effective July 1, 2004; and

WHEREAS the new system for licence renewals includes late fees for renewal applications received up to 90 days after the expiration of the licence, after which a new application must be filed; and

WHEREAS Subsection 545-4B(4) of Toronto Municipal Code Chapter 545, Licensing, currently indicates that if a renewal payment is not received before the date of expiration, the licence is not deemed to continue, which is inconsistent with the new renewal system; and

The Council of the City of Toronto HEREBY ENACTS as follows:

- 1. Subsection 545-4B(4) of Article I of Toronto Municipal Code Chapter 545, Licensing, is amended by adding the phrase "Subject to § 545-4G(4)," at the beginning of the subsection and deleting the following phrase: ", before the expiry of a licence,".
- 2. Subsection 545-4B(4)(b) is amended by deleting the word "and" after the word "expired" and before the comma and replacing it with the word "or".
