BY-LAW No. 687-2005

**To repeal By-law No. 149-2000 to reinvest the Board of the North York Performing Arts
Centre Corporation of its powers.**

WHEREAS the City is the owner of the Toronto Centre for the Arts, formerly the Ford Centre for the Performing Arts and the North York Performing Arts Centre; and

WHEREAS the North York Performing Arts Centre Corporation (“NYPACC”) is a corporation without share capital established under the *City of North York Act, 1988 (No. 2)*; and

WHEREAS that Act provides that the corporation shall have a board which shall manage, supervise and conduct the affairs of the corporation; and

WHEREAS by enactment of By-law No. 149-2000 “To suspend the operation of the North York Performing Arts Centre Corporation Board”, the City assumed the powers of the Board to manage, supervise and conduct the affairs of NYPACC, pursuant to the City’s power to do so in accordance with paragraph 5(1)[1] of Ontario Regulation 214/96 made under subsection 216(7) of the *Municipal Act, 2001*, S.O. 2001, c. 25, and the powers of the Board are currently exercised by City Council; and

WHEREAS Council wishes to reinvest the Board of its powers so that such powers are no longer exercised by City Council;

The Council of the City of Toronto HEREBY ENACTS as follows:

1. By-law No. 149-2000, “To suspend the operation of the North York Performing Arts Centre Corporation Board”, is repealed.
