BY-LAW No. 874-2005

To permanently close a portion of the Halton Street road allowance, abutting premises No. 199 Ossington Avenue.

WHEREAS it is recommended that a portion of the Halton Street road allowance, abutting Premises No. 199 Ossington Avenue, be permanently closed as a public highway and be sold on the terms and conditions set out in Clause 54 of Toronto and East York Community Council Report 6, as adopted by City Council at its meeting held on July 19, 20, 21 and 26, 2005; and

WHEREAS notice of the proposed by-law to permanently close the said portion of highway was posted on the notices page of the City's web site in accordance with the requirements of City of Toronto Municipal Code Chapter 162 and no one appeared to address the Toronto and East York Community Council at its meeting held on October 18, 2005;

The Council of the City of Toronto HEREBY ENACTS as follows:

1. The portion of the Halton Street road allowance, abutting Premises No. 199 Ossington Avenue, described as follows, is hereby permanently closed as a public highway:

Part of PIN 21274-0252 (LT) Part of Cecil Street, Plan 194 Toronto (aka Halton Street), designated as Part 1 on Plan 66R-21495, City of Toronto Land Titles Division of the Toronto Registry Office (No. 66).
