BY-LAW No. 354-2006

**To repeal By-law No. 243-2006 being a by-law “To designate the properties at
6 and 8 St. Thomas Street (University Apartments) as being of cultural heritage
value or interest.”**

WHEREAS By-law No. 243-2006, being a by-law to designate the properties at 6 and 8 St. Thomas Street (University Apartments) as being of cultural heritage value or interest provides that no objection to the notice of intention to designate was served upon the Clerk of the municipality; and

WHEREAS a notice of objection was in fact served on the Clerk of the municipality within the appeal period; and

WHEREAS as a result of the objection Council was not authorized to pass the designation by-law; and

WHEREAS it is necessary to correct this error;

The Council of the City of Toronto HEREBY ENACTS as follows:

1. By-law No. 243-2006 is repealed.
2. The City Solicitor is authorized to cause a copy of this by-law to be registered against the property described in Schedule “A” to this by-law in the proper Land Registry Office.
3. The City Clerk is authorized to cause a copy of this by-law to be served upon the owners of the properties at 6 and 8 St. Thomas Street and upon the Ontario Heritage Trust and to cause notice of this by-law to be published in a newspaper having general circulation in the City of Toronto as required by the *Ontario Heritage Act*.
