CITY OF TORONTO

BY-LAW No. 133-2007

To provide for the temporary closing of Bremner Boulevard to vehicular traffic between Lake Shore Boulevard and a point 75.5 metres north of Lake Shore Boulevard.

WHEREAS the City may, pursuant to sections 6, 7 and 8 of the City of Toronto Act, 2006, pass by-laws respecting, amongst other things, matters related to highways; and

WHEREAS pursuant to section 39 of the *City of Toronto Act*, 2006, the City has, except as otherwise provided in the Act, the ability to pass by-laws removing or restricting the common law right of passage by the public over a highway and the common law right of access to the highway by an owner of land abutting a highway;

The Council of the City of Toronto HEREBY ENACTS as follows:

1. In order to facilitate construction of two 54-storey residential building at a site on the south-east corner of York Street and Bremner Boulevard, Bremner Boulevard between Lake Shore Boulevard and a point 75.5 metres north of Lake Shore Boulevard be temporarily closed to vehicular traffic for a period of 12 months from February 7, 2007 to January 31, 2008.
