BY-LAW No. 627-2007

To name the public highway east of Sterling Road extending southerly from Bloor Street West as “Ruttan Street”.

WHEREAS City of Toronto Council has delegated the legislative authority for local routine matters, such as the naming of streets, to Community Councils by adopting Executive Committee Item 2.5, as amended, at its meeting held on February 5, 6, 7 and 8, 2007; and

WHEREAS pursuant to § 27-152E(5) of Chapter 27, Council Procedures, of the City of Toronto Municipal Code, Toronto and East York Community Council has the authority to pass a by-law naming the street; and

WHEREAS the notice of the proposed enactment of the draft by-law was posted on the City of Toronto web site from March 20th to March 26th, 2007, and interested persons were given an opportunity to be heard at a public meeting held on March 27, 2007, and it is appropriate to name the public highway east of Sterling Road extending southerly from Bloor Street West as “Ruttan Street”;

The Toronto and East York Community Council HEREBY ENACTS as follows:

1. Certain land composed of the public highway east of Sterling Road extending southerly from Bloor Street West, described by W. Kowalenko, City Surveyor, as follows, namely:

PIN 21331-0476 (LT).

PT LT 61 PLAN 287 PTS 18 & 19 PL 66R-21414

City of Toronto and Province of Ontario

Land Titles Division of the Toronto Registry Office (No. 66)

is named “Ruttan Street”.
