BY-LAW No. 889-2007

To amend further By-law No. 15-92 of the former Municipality of Metropolitan Toronto respecting pensions and other benefits.

WHEREAS By-law No. 15-92 of the former Municipality of Metropolitan Toronto, a by-law "To provide pensions for employees, their spouses and children of the Metropolitan Corporation and other participating employers", as heretofore amended, governs the Metropolitan Toronto Pension Plan; and

WHEREAS it is desired to harmonize the provisions of such By-law relating to spousal survival benefits with the applicable legislation, and to provide for cost-of-living increases for certain pensioners as of January 1, 2007;

The Council of the City of Toronto HEREBY ENACTS as follows:

- **1.** In this by-law,
 - (a) "By-law No. 15-92" means By-law No. 15-92 of the former Municipality as heretofore amended;
 - (b) "former Municipality" means The Municipality of Metropolitan Toronto.
- 2. Section 29 of By-law No. 15-92 is further amended by
 - (a) inserting the text "Subject to subsection (7)" at the beginning of subsection (1) and subsection (6); and
 - (b) adding the following subsection (7) thereto:
 - "(7) An entitlement to a benefit under this section 29 shall be subject to any right to or interest therein set out in a domestic contract or an order referred to in subsection 22(5)."
- **3.** Subsection 31(6) of By-law No. 15-92 is further amended by striking out the words "subclause (1)(a)(ii) is applicable and" in the first line.
