BY-LAW No. 721-2009

To amend the former City of Toronto Municipal Code Chapter 194, Footpaths, Bicycle Lanes and Pedestrian Ways, regarding bicycle lanes on Annette Street.

The Council of the City of Toronto HEREBY ENACTS as follows:

- **1.** Chapter 194, Footpaths, Bicycle Lanes and Pedestrian Ways, of the former City of Toronto Municipal Code, is amended as follows:
- A. By adding in alphabetical order to the list of bicycle lanes in § 194-6A the following:
