BY-LAW No. 972-2014

To amend By-law No. 1431-2013 to extend the period of interim control on lands generally bounded by Warden Avenue and Birchmount Road, immediately north and south of Ellesmere Road.

Whereas Council of the City of Toronto on November 14, 2013 enacted Interim Control By-law No. 1431-2013 to prohibit recycling and recovery facilities for a period of one year on employment lands north and south of Ellesmere Road, between Warden Avenue and Birchmount Road; and

Whereas authority is given to Council by Subsection 38 (2) of the *Planning Act*, R.S.O. 1990, c. P.13, as amended, to extend the period of time during which interim control will be in effect, provided the total period of time does not exceed two years from the date of the passing of the interim control by-law;

The Council of the City of Toronto enacts:

1. By-law No. 1431-2013 which effects interim control for lands north and south of Ellesmere Road, between Warden Avenue and Birchmount Road, is amended by deleting from Section 2 the words "one year" and replacing them with the words "eighteen months".
