BY-LAW 146-2018

To extend the hours of sale and service of liquor by holders of a licence under the Liquor Licence Act in the morning during the XXIII Olympic Winter Games, Pyeongchang 2018.

Whereas under subsection 62.1(1) of the Liquor Licence Act, the City may pass by-laws extending the hours of sale of liquor in all or part of the City by the holders of a licence and a by-law may authorize a specified officer or employee of the City to extend the hours of sale during events of municipal, provincial, national or international significance; and

Whereas under subsection 62.1(3) of the Liquor Licence Act, this by-law does not prevail over a condition that is imposed by the Registrar of Alcohol and Gaming under subsection 8(3), 14(1) or 17(5), or a conditions that is imposed under subsection 9(6), 12(2), 17(7) or 23(11) or (12) or a condition that is consented to by an applicant or licensee under subsection 12(2) or 17(7); and

Whereas the XXIII Olympic Winter Games will be held in Pyeongchang, South Korea on February 9 to February 25, 2018; and

Whereas Council wishes to extend the hours of sale of liquor in the City on certain dates during the XXIII Olympic Winter Games;

The Council of the City of Toronto enacts:

1. In the City of Toronto on February 19, 23 and 24, 2018 liquor may be sold by the holders of a licence under the Liquor Licence Act beginning at 7:00 a.m.
