BY-LAW 2-2023

To amend former City of Toronto Municipal Code Chapter 68, Museums, to reflect amendments to the agreement with the Sir William Campbell House Foundation.

In 2019 City Council adopted Item EC8.9, as amended in 2021 by Item EC26.4, directing the General Manager, Economic Development and Culture to negotiate certain amendments to the 1971 agreement between the City and the Sir William Campbell Foundation in respect of the management and operation of the Campbell House Museum and to amend former City of Toronto Municipal Code Chapter 68, Museums to add capital repairs to the responsibilities of the City of Toronto and make capital expenditures in accordance with the applicable budget allocation year over year and to make any other amendments to reflect the 1971 agreement, as necessary;

The Council of the City of Toronto enacts:

1. Chapter 68, Museums, of the Municipal Code of the former City of Toronto is amended as follows:
 - (1) Under § 68-1, deleting the definition of "SOCIETY" in its entirety.
 - (2) Under § 68-2(B), deleting the words "with the exception of the ground floor, as may be required for use by the Society, as a clubhouse for or in connection with its activities."
 - (3) Deleting § 68-13 in its entirety and replacing with:

§ 68-13. Responsibility for capital repairs and exterior maintenance.

The City shall be solely responsible for the capital repairs and exterior maintenance at the House, more particularly defined in the governing agreement between the City and the Board, as may be amended from time to time. Such capital expenditures shall be in accordance with the applicable City budget allocation for each year. All other repairs and maintenance are shall be the responsibility of the Board. The Board shall not encumber or obstruct or allow to be encumbered or obstructed the sidewalks, curbs, areaways or rights of way, in any manner.

2. This by-law shall come into force on the day it is enacted.
