BY-LAW 144-2025

To appoint a Deputy City Manager, Community and Emergency Services, and to repeal By-law 682-2021.

Whereas under section 226.3, 226.4(1) and 226.4(2) of the City of Toronto Act, 2006, the Mayor may appoint a chief administrative officer, may hire and dismiss a head of any division or the head of any other part of the City's organizational structure, and may determine the organizational structure of the City; and

Whereas the chief administrative officer, under the title of City Manager, was appointed and assigned duties by Mayoral Decision 8-2022, and the powers to determine the organizational structure of the City was delegated to the City Manager by Mayoral Decision 6-2023; and

Whereas the City Manager has created the new position of Deputy City Manager, Community and Emergency Services and made other necessary changes to the organizational structure of the City; and

Whereas the authority to appoint Deputy City Managers was delegated to City Council by Mayoral Decision 6-2023;

The Council of the City of Toronto enacts:

- 1. Kate Bassil is appointed Deputy City Manager, Community and Emergency Services, and shall have those duties and responsibilities of the City Manager as may be assigned by the City Manager or Council from time to time.
- 2. This by-law comes into effect on effect on the latter of April 22, 2025, or the date on which Kate Bassil has entered into a written employment agreement with the City for the Deputy City Manager, Community and Emergency Services position.
- 3. On the date this by-law comes into force, By-law 682-2021 is repealed.
