BY-LAW 1224-2026

To appoint an Interim City Solicitor.

Whereas under section 226.4(1) and 226.4(2) of the City of Toronto Act, 2006, the Mayor may determine the organizational structure of the City and may hire and dismiss a head of any division or the head of any other part of the City's organizational structure; and

Whereas the authority to appoint a City Solicitor was delegated to City Council by Mayoral Decision 6-2023;

The Council of the City of Toronto enacts:

- 1.** Sharmila M. Clark is appointed Interim City Solicitor, effective September 8, 2026 and until such time as a City Solicitor has been appointed and shall have all the powers and duties imposed upon the Solicitor by Article V of Chapter 169, Officials, City, of The City of Toronto Municipal Code.
- 2.** By-law 116-2017 is repealed.
- 3.** This by-law comes into effect on the latter of September 8, 2026 or the date on which Sharmila M. Clark has entered into a written employment agreement with the City for the Interim City Solicitor position.
