## CITY OF TORONTO

## **MAYORAL DECISION 11-2022**

To delegate powers to determine the organizational structure of the City and to hire and dismiss certain City officials to the City Manager and to City Council.

The Mayor has decided as follows:

- A. Delegation to City Manager to hire and dismiss certain City officials:
  - 1. The power of the Mayor to hire or dismiss a head of any division or the head of any other part of the organizational structure under Section 226.4(2) of the City of Toronto Act, 2006 is delegated to the City Manager except for the positions listed in sections A(2) and A(4) of this Mayoral Decision.
  - 2. The Mayor retains the power and the delegation provided to the City Manager in section A(1) of this Mayoral Decision does not apply to a decision to hire or dismiss the following heads of a division or heads of another other part of the organizational structure:
    - 1. Deputy City Managers
    - 2. Chief Communications Officer
    - 3. Chief People Officer
    - 4. Chief Information Security Officer
    - 5. Director of the Strategic Partnerships
    - 6. Executive Director of Housing Secretariat
    - 7. General Manager of Children's Services
    - 8. General Manager of Economic Development and Culture
    - 9. Chief and General Manager of Toronto Paramedic Services
    - 10. Executive Director of Social Development, Finance and Administration
    - 11. General Manager of Shelter, Support and Housing Administration
    - 12. General Manager of Parks, Forestry and Recreation
    - 13. General Manager of Seniors Services and Long-Term Care
    - 14. Chief Engineer and Executive Director Engineering and Construction Services
    - 15. Executive Director of Municipal Licensing and Standards
    - 16. Executive Director of Policy, Planning, Finance and Administration
    - 17. General Manager of Solid Waste Management Services
    - 18. Executive Director FIFA World Cup Hosting 2026
    - 19. General Manager of Toronto Water
    - 20. Executive Director of Transit Expansion Office

- 21. General Manager of Transportation Services
- 22. Chief Planner and Executive Director of City Planning
- 23. Director of Office of Emergency Management
- 24. Chief Technology Officer
- 25. Director of 311
- 26. General Manager of Fleet Services
- 27. Executive Director of Environment and Climate
- 28. Executive Director of Corporate Real Estate Management
- 29. Executive Director of Financial Planning
- 3. The City Manager may sub-delegate the authority in section A(1) to a City official in writing.
- 4. Under paragraph 3 of section 20(2) of the City of Toronto Act, 2006, only the City Manager or the City Manager's sub-delegates can exercise the power delegated in section A(1) of this Mayoral Decision.
- 5. For greater clarity, the Mayor retains the power under Section 226.3 of the City of Toronto Act, 2006 to appoint and dismiss the City Manager.
- B. Delegation to City Council the power to hire or dismiss the City Solicitor:
  - 1. The power of the Mayor to hire or dismiss the City Solicitor under Section 226.4(2) of the City of Toronto Act, 2006 is delegated to City Council.
  - 2. Under paragraph 3 of section 20(2) of the City of Toronto Act, 2006, only City Council can exercise the power delegated in section B(1) of this Mayoral Decision.
- C. Delegation to the City Manager the powers to determine the organizational structure of the City:
  - 1. The power of the Mayor to determine the organizational structure of the City under Section 226.4(1) of the City of Toronto Act, 2006 is delegated to the City Manager except for the parts of the organizational structure listed in section C(2) of this Mayoral Decision.
  - 2. The Mayor retains the power and the delegation provided to the City Manager in section C(1) of this Mayoral Decision does not apply to determining the organizational structure of the following:
    - a. Any organizational decision or change that would impact the reporting or organizational structure of a position that reports to the City Manager or a Deputy City Manager as of the date of this Mayoral Decision;
    - b. The creation of a new service area or City division that would report to the City Manager or a Deputy City Manager; and
    - c. Any modification to a City division's mandate or service area(s).
  - 3. The City Manager may sub-delegate the authority in C(1) to a City official in writing.

4. Under paragraph 3 of section 20(2) of the City of Toronto Act, 2006, only the City Manager or the City Manager's sub-delegates can exercise the power delegated in section C(1) of this Mayoral Decision.
