The Mayor and Members of Toronto City Council are deeply saddened to learn of the tragic passing of Emad Rozik on July 6<sup>th</sup>, 2010.

Emad was born in Cairo, Egypt on December 25, 1960. After visiting Canada numerous times as a student and tourist, he immigrated to start a new life here in 1988. Holding a university degree in accounting, he first worked as an assistant manager at Esso retail locations. In 1993, he moved to Petro-Canada to become manager of a gas station at Kennedy Road and Lawrence Avenue East. As he progressed to take on responsibility for other Petro-Canada sites, he earned a reputation as a kind and fair-minded leader who executed his duties with professionalism and compassion for others. In 2009, he left Petro-Canada to open his own business, the Midland Car Wash. Ever concerned about the community, Emad renovated the facility and worked with nearby Bendale BTI to provided co-operative opportunities for students enrolled in the school's automotive program.

Devoutly religious, Emad was a respected parishioner of St. Mark's Church in Scarborough, where he led the congregation in reaching out to help less fortunate people around the world. He is survived by his wife Magui Said, daughter Marina, son Michael, sister Doiris Rozik and parents Shafik and Madlin Rozik.
