## **Local Arts Service Organizations**

WHAT WE ARE: Community arts organizations whose focus is to interact with our community using all forms of art as the catalyst. We build a strong sense of belonging and shared purpose amongst our neighbours at the local, grassroots level.

WHO WE SERVE: We are inclusive; our free art programs offer something for all ages, skill levels and interests. We engage with children, families, seniors, members, volunteers and artists of all disciplines. We support under-served communities through arts programming, activities and events.

OUR MAIN FOCUS IS YOUTH: Identifying their needs, helping them develop a creative voice, self-esteem and employment skills.

BY THE NUMBERS: In 2009/10, our programs directly impacted 7000 children and youth in 19 under-served and priority neighbourhoods across the City. We employed 350 artists, engaged 500 volunteers, involved 110 partners and our activities reached an audience of over 2 million people.
