	tice of Motion – MM[11.1] – Increasing parking infraction fines on arterial roads and in bicycle lanes ing rush hour periods to \$500 (from the current \$30 to \$60 fine levels) is likely to result in: a) increased compliance of the City's parking bylaws (and as such fewer tickets being issued); b) an increase in the trial request rate.
	e financial impact of such a significant increase in the fine level is difficult to predict given that it is
	uenced by driver behaviour and compliance levels, as well as trial request rates and associated court position. Despite the significant increase in the fine level, revenue impacts may be neutral if
sig	nificantly fewer tickets are issued due to higher compliance. If the number of tickets issued does not
	crease significantly, additional revenues may be realized, however any increased revenues will be
	pendent on trial request rates and trial disposition. e second recommendation may have financial impacts. The potential direction to increase enforcement
of e	existing by-laws is general; however, if the intention is to increase staff to enforce the by-laws, there will
be	additional costs. Further analysis would be required.
