Notice of Motion – MM2.1 – Policy Regarding False Fire Alarms- City Council on April 15, 2010, adopte the 2010 Operating Budget for Toronto Fire Services including changing the False Alarm Bylaw so that the first malicious or nuisance false alarm would no longer be free. The incremental net revenue impact this change is \$4.745 million in 2010 with a further annualization of \$1.587 million in 2011 for total \$6.332 million in net revenue. This is based on a charge of \$1,050 for each false alarm response when trucks are dispatched. The actual revenue to date from single family homes is currently unavailable at would need to be estimated by Toronto Fire Services.
