Authorization to Release Section 37 Funds to Toronto District School Board for Capital Improvements to Summit Heights Public School Playground - by Councillor James Pasternak, seconded by Councillor Paul Ainslie

Recommendations

Councillor James Pasternak, seconded by Councillor Paul Ainslie, recommends that:

1. City Council increase the 2011 Operating Budget for the Community Partnership and Investment Program, administered by Social Development, Finance and Administration Division, by \$45,000.00, fully funded by Section 37 community benefits related to 7 and 9 Tippet Road (source: XR3026-3700393), to provide a one-time grant of \$45,000.00 to Toronto District School Board for capital improvements to the playgrounds of Summit Heights Public School, 193 Armour Boulevard; and
2. City Council direct that the \$45,000.00 be forwarded to the Toronto District School Board once the Toronto District School Board signs an Undertaking governing the use of the funds and the reporting requirements.

Summary

Authority is being sought to amend the Operating Budget for the Community Partnership and Investment Program by \$45,000.00, fully funded by Section 37 community benefits related to 7 and 9 Tippet Road, for capital improvements by the Toronto District School Board to the playgrounds at Summit Height Public School.

The playgrounds at Summit Heights Public School serve as the local park for the neighbourhood. The local parent council has said it is contributing \$15,000.00 and the Toronto District School Board is expected to contribute \$45,000.00 to this project.

The \$45,000.00 in Section 37 funds is part of a larger amount secured in the development at 7 and 9 Tippet Road, approved by the Ontario Municipal Board in December, 2008. The funds were secured for the purposes of improving the existing recreational capital facilities in Ward 10, and have been received by the City.
