SUMMARY

This report provides cumulative data on the diversity composition and geographic dispersion of the public appointment recommendations of the Civic Appointments Committee as requested by Council.

Recommendation 10 of EX4.7, adopted by City Council at its meeting on April 12 and 13, 2011, regarding Amendments to the Public Appointments Policy directs the City Manager to report how the equity provisions in the Policy have been met at the time appointment recommendations by the Civic Appointments Committee are before City Council.
