## 2013 Toronto Parking Authority Rates Toronto Municipal Code, Chapter 441, Fees and Charges

The Budget Committee of Toronto City Council will be considering Toronto Parking Authority - 2013 Recommended Operating Budget, and the 2013 Recommended Capital Budget and 2014 - 2022 Recommended Capital Plan at its meetings on November 7, 2012 and November 12, 2012.

Notice is hereby given that City officials are recommending that the maximum hourly onstreet parking rate as outlined in City of Toronto Municipal Code Chapter 441, Fees and Charges, Appendix G - Schedule 1, Toronto Parking Authority, remain unchanged.

Any comments received after the Budget Committee meeting will be processed to Council.

The Budget Committee's recommendations will be forwarded for Executive Committee's consideration at its special meeting on November 19, 2012, and to City Council at its meeting on November 27, 2012. The adopted fees will be implemented through a by-law that will amend the Municipal Code, if necessary.

While the 2013 Operating Budget does not recommend any rate change, the appropriate Committee may change these recommendations and Toronto City Council may adopt rates that differ from the recommendations, including rates that are higher or lower than the rates set out above.
