Dear City of Toronto Executive Committee:

RE: Casino in Toronto

On Monday, you will be reviewing a very important report from the City Manager on the issue of a Casino in Toronto. We wanted to make sure that you understand that the development of a Casino/Entertainment Complex on the Exhibition Place site has VERY SERIOUS implications for the Canadian National Exhibition (CNE), a 135 year old institution in this City.

An event, the scope and size of the CNE, could <u>NOT</u> be staged on the radically reduced footprint that would remain after the construction of a large Casino complex at Exhibition Place. Therefore, a resolution was passed at the September 27th meeting of the CNEA Board of Directors stating that: "The CNEA is opposed to having a permanent Casino/Entertainment complex built at Exhibition Place".

PLEASE KEEP IN MIND:

- The CNE is a major economic generator for the City and the Province. A 2009 Economic Impact study confirms that CNE had a gross economic impact of \$58.6 million on the GTA and \$80 million on the Province of Ontario.
- Approximately 5,000 youth employees are at work on any given day of the Ex, many of whom
 are from priority neighbourhoods. Approximately 70% of the CNEs annual budget invested in
 JOBS.
- Our partners include small, medium and large businesses with long-standing relationships with the CNE and each of whom have their economic impact on the region.
- This summer, the CNE attracted 1.39 million visitors with the majority coming from the GTA.
- We have strong connections with Ontario Agriculture industry and Agriculture Societies,
 Tourism and Labour.
- The CNE attracts performers and participants from across the province, the country and from throughout North America.
- Each year, the CNE distributes 1.2 million FREE Kids Passes to children within the GTA and across southern Ontario from Peterborough to the east, Simcoe County to the north, London, to the west and Niagara to the south.

I trust you will find this information useful as you review this issue from <u>all</u> perspectives.
