The Mayor and Members of Toronto City Council are deeply saddened to learn of the passing of Trent Frayne on Saturday, February 11, 2012 at the age of 93 in the presence of his family.

Born and raised in Brandon, Manitoba, Trent made his home in Etobicoke. Trent is predeceased by his wife of 63 years June Callwood, who was also the founder of Casey House, and his son Casey. He leaves his son Brant, his daughters Jesse and Jill and five grandchildren: Emma, Marie, Lucy and Jack Manchester and Bree Fitzgerald.

Trent Frayne was a distinguished journalist whose love for sport ignited similar passions in readers across Canada. The Frayne family, also recognized for their support and championship of people living with HIV/AIDS, are especially remembered through Casey House. Casey House was named in memory of Callwood and Frayne's youngest son Casey, who was killed by a drunk driver in 1982.

Frayne will remain in the hearts and minds of Torontonians, and will be remembered as a voice that spoke in both words and actions as a true inspiration in our City.
