Refusal of a boulevard café permit located at 684 Queen Street West, Euclid Avenue flankage

SUMMARY

This staff report is about a matter for which the Toronto and East York Community Council has delegated authority from City Council to make a final decision.

To report on the refusal to issue a permit by the Municipal Licensing and Standards based on the application for a boulevard café permit located at 684 Queen Street West, on the Euclid Avenue flankage.

RECOMMENDATIONS

Municipal Licensing and Standards recommends that the Toronto and East York Community Council:

1. Deny the application for the proposed boulevard café application at 684 Queen Street West, on the Euclid Avenue flankage.

Financial Impact

There are no financial implications resulting from the adoption of this report.

ISSUE BACKGROUND

An application for a boulevard café located at 684 Queen Street West, on the Euclid Avenue flankage was received on March 16th, 2011 from the business owner representing Dark Horse Espresso Bar (Queen West) Ltd. operating as Dark Horse Espresso Bar.

The application submitted was seeking permission to establish a boulevard café on the Euclid Avenue flankage for 35 square meters, which would accommodate approximately 22 patrons. (**Appendix No. 1**)

In accordance with the former City of Toronto Municipal Code Chapter 313-36B (4) a public poll of owners and tenants within 120 metres of the proposed café on a residential flank.

A poll dated October 4, 2011 with the last date for filing a response being November 2, 2011 was conducted by the City Clerk's Office, Elections and Registry Services for the Wallace Avenue flankage, in English and Portuguese, between the premises 193 – Wallace Avenue, 202 – 222 Wallace to determine neighbourhood support.

The results of the poll received from Election and Registry Services indicate that the majority of ballots cast were not in favour of the application.

On November 4, 2011, a refusal letter was sent to the business owner representing Dark Horse Espresso Bar (Queen West) Ltd advising the applicant that the boulevard café application was denied due to the majority of the received ballots were not in favour.

A letter dated November 16, 2011 was received by Municipal Licensing & Standards from the business owner representing Dark Horse Espresso Bar (Queen West) Ltd to appeal the decision of the denial for a boulevard café.

COMMENTS

Where a refusal is appealed in writing under § 313-77, the Commissioner shall prepare and forward a report to the Committee setting out the grounds for refusal of the application, which shall be considered in conjunction with the appeal
