Re: Municipal Significance Designation - Celebrate Yonge

Please accept this letter as our submission to request that the Community Council declare our event, **Celebrate Yonge**, as an event of Municipal Significance for liquor licence extension permits as noted below.

Celebrate Yonge is a community collaboration featuring unique street experiences for people to enjoy on Yonge Street in the heart of Downtown Yonge. This destination event celebrates Yonge Street from Queen Street to Gerrard Street from Friday August 17 to Sunday September 16, 2012. This four-week celebration of the vibrancy of Yonge Street will feature expanded street space for people to engage with the neighbourhood's diverse retailers, restaurants and entertainment venues.

The event dates tie-in with the end of the summer/ beginning of fall and captures the energy of the visitors season, back to school, the CNE (opening date is August 17) and TIFF (the last day of which is September 16, 2012)
