

- 60 employers connected to employment planning through EDC and Invest Toronto








#### Working with Job Seekers





# Advancing a 'Made in Toronto' Approach: Evolving Intergovernmental Context



- Brighter Prospects recommends:
  - Replacing OW and ODSP with a single integrated program
  - Integrating employment services at the local level
  - Devolving responsibility to municipalities for the integrated social assistance program and integrated employment services
- Drummond Report calls for the consolidation of employment services.

Implementation of these recommendations will have important implications for City strategies and services

#### Advancing a 'Made in Toronto' Approach: An Evolving City Role in Evolving System

To accelerate progress towards an integrated employment services system in Toronto, the City and the Province must:

- 1. Establish a true partnership and work collaboratively to implement the recommendations of *Brighter Prospects* and the *Drummond Report*
- 2. Establish a City-Provincial Table to determine how to better plan and manage employment services in Toronto.
