## **2013 OPERATING BUDGET BRIEFING NOTE** Additional Information on PF&R Parks Turf and Sports Field Maintenance

## **Background:**

At its December 3, 2012 meeting Budget Committee, directed the General Manager of Parks, Forestry and Recreation prepare a briefing note on turf maintenance standards for parks and sports fields and the number of staff allocated by district, to achieve these standards.

## **Specialized Sport Field Crews:**

- By establishing designated sports field crews to deliver specialized maintenance programs throughout the season, staff will be able to provide a higher maintenance standard on sport fields.
- These permanent staff, will aerate, top-dress, over-seed, fertilize and provide minor repairs to sports facility infrastructure throughout the growing season at an increased frequency for class A&B sports fields and with greater consistency for class C sports fields and General Parkland.
- By utilizing permanent staff, annual training costs will be reduced and experience will accumulate. This provides greater efficiency by not having to train seasonal staff annually.
- During the winter months, these staff will be reassigned to artificial ice rinks, thereby reducing the number of seasonal temporary staff required.
- General parkland turf crews will be solely dedicated to pick litter, trim and cut grass, enabling them to achieve established general turf maintenance standards in parks.

The following table illustrates the improved turf maintenance service standards at A, B & C Class Sports Fields:
