Traffic Control Signals - Burnhamthorpe Road and Meadowbank Road - by Councillor Peter Milczyn, seconded by Councillor Vincent Crisanti

Recommendations

Councillor Peter Milczyn, seconded by Councillor Vincent Crisanti, recommends that:

1. City Council refer Item EY17.26 back to the Etobicoke York Community Council for consideration at its meeting on April 9, 2013, in order to circulate Notice and allow area residents an opportunity to submit comments or address the Community Council.

Summary

At its meeting on July 11, 12 and 13, 2012, City Council adopted Item EY17.26, which approved:

1. the installation of traffic control signals at the intersection of Burnhamthorpe Road and Meadowbank Road; and
2. the removal of the pedestrian crossover on Burnhamthorpe Road at Meadowbank Road, in conjunction with installing traffic control signals.

When this Item was approved at Etobicoke York Community Council in 2012, a few of the residents of Ward 5, who reside adjacent to the proposed installation, were unaware of the Item being tabled. They therefore did not have the opportunity to attend or speak to the local matter before Community Council.

These Ward 5 residents, along with parishioners and clergy of St. James United Church on Bloor Street, have since contacted Councillor Milczyn's office and requested the opportunity to speak at Community Council on this installation, and also are asking that Transportation Services Staff review and consider their preferred / alternate location for this pedestrian activated PXO, across from St. James Church.
