Recommendations

Councillor Joe Mihevc, seconded by Councillor Shelley Carroll, recommends that:

1. City Council request the City Clerk to report back to City Council by December 31, 2013 on the feasibility of establishing an official on-line petition system.

Summary

While the public is given multiple opportunities to provide input and feedback on local matters through comments submitted to or spoken at Committees of Council, and through a vote in municipal elections, the City of Toronto could improve government transparency and increase civic participation and awareness through the creation of an on-line petition system. The on-line petition system would serve as an official platform where 'e-petitions' could be posted and shared with other members of the public.

As suggested by members of 'My City My Voice', an initiative of the Canadian Coalition of Youth Councils, an official on-line petition system would be a constructive framework to engage with constituents within a responsive government, in an equitable approach to creating and modifying municipal policies. The official on-line petition system could be used as an additional tool for Members of Council to become more aware of local issues and city-wide matters. The on-line petition system would also incorporate the same values as Toronto's Open Data system, in an effort to further pursue our commitment to an open and accessible government which has the capacity and responsibility to empower all citizens.
