RE: PG 29.4 Electronic and Illuminated Sign Study and Recommendations for Amendments to Chapter 694 of the Municipal Code (Ward All)

This is to request that the Planning and Growth Management Committee defer this item to allow for public consultation at the ward level on this controversial proposal that is of concern to our member Residents' Associations.

The move to expand the distribution of digital billboards has been subject to debate in cities across North America. Some have banned them and many, like Toronto, have restricted them to certain areas. In the wake of numerous applications for variances, the City is now considering changes which may represent a more coordinated and systematic approach to the approval process. However the substantive changes are significant, highly detailed and need to be understood in a land-use planning context. There needs to be time to consider the proposals at the ward level with input from individual members of Council and residents.
