Subject: Demolition of a Designated Heritage Property in the North Rosedale Heritage Conservation District and Construction of a Replacement Structure – 6 Astley Avenue

Recommendations:

The Toronto Preservation Board recommends to the Toronto and East York Community Council that:

- 1. City Council approve the request to demolish 6 Astley Avenue, an "unrated" structure in the North Rosedale Heritage Conservation District in accordance with Section 42 of the Ontario Heritage Act subject to the owner, prior to the issuance of a demolition permit, submitting photo-documentation of the existing structure at 6 Astley Avenue to the satisfaction of the Manager, Heritage Preservation Services.**
- 2. City Council approve the plans for the replacement building as shown in the plans submitted by the applicant, including plans and elevations prepared by Richard Wengle Architect Inc. dated December 12 and 13, 2012, all date stamped received by Heritage Preservation Services December 17, 2012, on file with the Manager, Heritage Preservation Services, and that the replacement structure be constructed substantially in accordance with the submitted plans, subject to the following condition:**
 - a. Prior to the issuance of any heritage permit for the replacement structure located at 6 Astley Avenue, the applicant will provide building plans and a landscape plan to the satisfaction of the Manager, Heritage Preservation Services.**
