Dear Mayor Ford, Deputy Mayor Kelly, and City Councillors:

We are writing to express FoNTRA's support for the 2014 Service Levels for the City Planning Division and the 12 additional planning staff provided for in the 2014 Recommended City Budget, and recommend their approval by City Council. The 2014 Service levels include completion of 18 City Building studies, reducing the backlog of Avenue and Area studies, initiating three Heritage Conservation District (HCD) studies, and building the base capacity to initiate and complete five HCD studies per year.

FoNTRA believes this increased capacity to undertake planning studies will contribute to the health, prosperity and well-being of the City. Good planning is based on area plans and policies that are consistently applied. The increased focus on proactive planning along with a positive vision-based approach to planning is to be applauded. We are also encouraged by the identified need to respond to cultural shifts, including more engagement with Toronto residents and communities.

We support greater consistency in planning decisions, especially with respect to interpretation of Toronto's Official Plan policies and Zoning By-laws as well as those decisions made by Committees of Adjustment rather than a focus on negotiating individual development proposals on an ad hoc basis.
