# Policy on Board Governance Structures

## **Toronto Pan Am Sports Centre Inc. Board Of Directors**

	<ul> <li>NEW:</li> <li>Following City Council's appointment of citizen members as Directors of the Board of TPASC Inc., with a term taking effect on January 2, 2016, the City of Toronto appointees as Directors of the Board of TPASC Inc. are: <ul> <li>2 citizen members</li> <li>the Director of Community Recreation in Parks, Forestry and Recreation</li> <li>the Director of Accounting Services in the Office of the Treasurer</li> <li>the Director of Facilities Operations in Facilities Management</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
Chair and Vice-Chair	The Board shall have a Chair and Vice-Chair, both of whom shall be Directors. The term of office of the Chair and Vice-Chair shall be a maximum of 2 consecutive years and, for certainty, the Chair and the Vice- Chair shall not be nominees of the same Shareholder.

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The right to nominate the Chair and the Vice-Chair shall alternate between the Shareholders every 2 years. For the initial 2 year term, the Board shall appoint the Chair and Vice-Chair. The Vice-Chair shall succeed to the office of the Chair upon the expiry of the Chair's term unless the Shareholder who nominated the Vice-Chair otherwise determines. A Shareholder may change its designee as Chair or Vice-Chair, as applicable, within its 2 year nominating period.

The Chair shall not be entitled to a second or casting vote on any matter that comes before the Board.

**Term of Office** Each Director appointed by the City shall serve at pleasure of City Council for a term of 2 years and until their successor is appointed. Incumbent Directors may be reappointed by the applicable nominating Shareholder.

A citizen member may be reappointed by City Council for a renewal term of 2 years without a recruitment process; a full recruitment process must be conducted every 4 years. The limit on length of service for a citizen member is a maximum of 4 consecutive 2-year terms, for a limit of 8 consecutive years.

**Eligibility Requirements** Citizen members are ineligible for appointment to the Board if they fail to satisfy the eligibility requirements for appointment as set out in the City's *Public Appointments Policy*.

Under the *Business Corporations Act* (Ontario), Citizen members are ineligible for appointment to the Board if any of the following conditions apply:

- the person is less than 18 years of age
- the person has been found under the *Substitute Decisions Act, 1992* (Ontario) or the *Mental Health Act* (Ontario) to be incapable of managing property or who has been found to be incapable by a court in Canada or elsewhere
- the person is not an individual
- the person has the status of a bankrupt

Appointments Process – Citizen Members	<b>NEW:</b> Citizen members of the board appointed by the City are recruited through an Advertised Recruitment process. The process may be implemented with the assistance of an external search consultant.
	Screening of applicants is conducted by a City Staff Review Team and/or a search consultant. TPASC Inc. staff may provide advice on qualifications of candidates and any potential conflicts of interest for qualified candidates.
	A Corporation Nominating Panel, with advice and support from City staff and/or a search consultant, short-lists and interviews candidates and recommends nominees and alternates to City Council.

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**Remuneration** No members of the Board receive remuneration for serving as a Board member. Members may be reimbursed for their reasonable out-of-pocket expenses in attending Board meetings in accordance with a policy approved by the Board.
