Recommendations

Councillor Michael Thompson, seconded by Councillor Shelley Carroll, recommends that:

1. City Council increase the composition of the Toronto Music Industry Advisory Council by one additional Councillor at-large, so that the composition will now be up to 35 Members, including two (2) Councillors at-large.

Summary

City Council at its December 16, 17 and 18, 2013 meeting, adopted as amended, Item ED27.2 and established the Toronto Music Industry Advisory Council. The Advisory Council's composition is up to 34 members, including a Member of Council at-large, to be appointed on the recommendation of the Striking Committee.

The Striking Committee's recommendation to appoint a Councillor at-large is before City Council at this meeting as Item ST13.2.

In recognition of the tremendous interest in the Toronto Music Industry, Council would benefit from the addition of another Councillor at-large position on the Advisory Council.

This matter is urgent as the appointment of Council Members is before the February 19 and 20, 2014 Council meeting.

Requires Re-opening

Item ED27.2 headed "Toronto Music Sector (Collaborating for Competitiveness - Implementation Action 6)", adopted by City Council on December 16, 17 and 18, 2013, only as it pertains to the number of Council Member at-large positions on the Toronto Music Industry Advisory Council, in order to consider increasing the composition.
