## RE **PE8.5: REVISIONS TO THE TREE BY-LAWS**

Heard on November 23rd, 2015 by Parks and Environment Reference No. P:\20156\Cluster A\PFR08-112315-AFS#20848 Advancing to Council with Bills attached on December 9, 2015

The Annex Residents Association requests that agenda item PE8.5 be referred back to the Parks and Recreation Committee as a deputation item. PE8.5 excludes councillors and the public in regard to "as of right" applications to remove trees.

As noted by the Confederation of Resident and Ratepayer Associations (CORRA), the proposed changes sharply reduce the notice period from 14 days to 0 days for "as of right" applications and, furthermore, fail to adequately define those applications. Such far-reaching revisions should not be made without adequate public notice and response time.

We support CORRA's view that PE8.5 "neuters Councillors while making them the brunt when the public becomes aware that a mature tree has been approved for removal with one day's notice to the public advising the approval."

The Annex is home to nearly 10,000 trees, many of them a century old. Abundant mature trees are a defining characteristic of our neighbourhood, and play a vital environmental role in the City's efforts to maintain the tree canopy. The ARA urges the Council to do everything in its power to protect this critical resource.
