#### Application #1: FEAT for Children of Incarcerated Youth 432 Horner Ave, Toronto, ON, M8W 2B2

**Group Overview:** The organization provides supportive programming that fosters self-esteem and security for children and youth affected by parental incarceration. By supporting young people and teaching healthy coping strategies, the organization hopes to empower these of victims of crime to overcome adversity and embrace a brighter future. The organization is located in Ward 6 - Etobicoke-Lakeshore.

**Project Description:** This project aims to develop the leadership, life skills, education, employability and careers of children of incarcerated parents. The project also aims to enable youth to form positive mentoring relationships and participate in a peer support group to discuss issues and learn healthy coping strategies. Project activities include a weekly series of interactive workshops for youth affected by parental incarceration. Following the completion of workshops, youth will receive a certificate and become mentors in FEAT's after school program. Youth will also have the opportunity to join the advisory committee and work with staff to plan program activities, organize a community improvement project, and manage an anti-violence campaign. Project impact includes increased leadership opportunities for youth through mentorship, and positive peer relationships to create a stronger and safer community while developing individual protective factors to break the cycle of intergenerational crime and youth violence.

The group aims to create safe and inclusive spaces that foster self-expression and healing through the performance arts and storytelling. The group is located in 42 - Scarborough-Rouge River.

**Project Description:** This project aims to develop the leadership of youth through training two dedicated volunteers in program planning, lesson plan development, creating safe spaces, and participant and artist facilitator outreach. Project activities include training for youth leaders who will develop and implement an arts program with 10 performing youth artists to increase their professional development through professional and peer mentorship. The goals of the project are: to increase the capacity of volunteer staff to organize youth communities, through increased leadership skills, program and event planning co-ordination skills, and; to increase the professional development and capacity of youth performing artists.
