# Refugee Types

There are two main categories of resettled refugees:

- **Government-Assisted Refugees (GARs)**: The federal government funds a network of settlement agencies to provide assistance to GARs, and provides income support for up to 12 months based on provincial social assistance rates.
- **Privately Sponsored Refugees (PSRs):** PSRs are supported by private sponsors of organizations or groups of individuals, including financial support and practical assistance for the first year in Canada.

## Federal Plan

• 25,000 refugees by March 2016, more throughout the year

10,000 by end of December (primarily PSRs)
Additional 15,000 by the end of February (GARs, some PSRs)
Additional arrivals throughout 2016 (GARs and PSRs)

- Screening prior to refugees leaving current locations
- Most vulnerable prioritized for resettlement

## Federal Plan

- Landings in Toronto and Montreal
- 36 destination cities
- Desire for even distribution across country
- Estimated federal cost: \$678M over the next six years
- Goal: to bring refugees fast, while also doing it right

#### **Key Considerations**

- Toronto has a long history of welcoming newcomers
- Toronto has a strong and established settlement sector
- Key systems are in place, preparations have been made
- We will continue to focus on high-impact activities
- Particular focus on private sponsorships

#### The Refugee Resettlement Program

- Aims to mobilize the existing supports, while facilitating enhancements where needed
- Focuses on strategies that can create the most impact

#### **Three Key Roles**

- Coordination
- Enhancement
- Integration

#### **Immediate Priorities**

- Appropriate supports for PSRs and their sponsors
- Housing help for all refugees

#### **Actions Initiated**

- Enhancements to existing housing supports
- One-on-one supports for sponsors
- Sponsors information fair at City Hall
- Webpage

#### **Next Steps**

- Meetings: Inter-Divisional Team and Inter-Agency Task Force
- National planning meeting
- Service agreements with partner agencies
- Acceleration of settlement supports in City facilities
- Information fairs across Toronto
- Release of webpage
