- Community Projects The Cultural Hotspot is comprised of vibrant neighbourhoods with local community theatre groups, choirs, visual artists, writers, musicians, filmmakers, emerging and professional artists. The Hotspot will highlight and celebrate events already happening in the area.
- **Cultural Loops** Selected Cultural Loops will be featured in the Hotspot, showcasing local arts, culture, history and businesses. A series of self-guided tours will be developed to inspire visitors and residents alike to explore different neighbourhoods in the Hotspot.
