In addition, beds will be made available to care for eligible individuals currently being served within the shelter system. • The CCAC are assessing current Shelter Support and Housing Administration clients to determine the number of long-term care beds to be dedicated to special populations. <p><u>Options Considered:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • To start LTCHS mandatory capital renewal, acquiring land or a site was necessary to minimize resident displacement and disruption. • The opportunity to co-locate on the City-owned Seaton House site, also identified for redevelopment, became the catalyst along with opportunities to enhance care and accommodation for vulnerable seniors.
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
