2016 Toronto Parking Authority Rates Toronto Municipal Code, Chapter 441, Fees and Charges

Toronto City Council will be considering Toronto Parking Authority – 2016 Recommended Operating Budget, and the 2016 Recommended Capital Budget and 2017 - 2025 Recommended Capital Plan on December 9 and 10, 2015.

Notice is hereby given that City officials are recommending a change to Appendix G of Chapter 441 Fees and Charges, Appendix G - Schedule 1, Toronto Parking Authority to change the maximum rate from \$3.54 to \$4.43 per hour.

This market based fee change reflects the maximum fee that is able to be implemented at on-street metered or machined locations through the delegated process outlined in Chapter 179.7.D of the City of Toronto Municipal Code. The delegated process requires the concurrence of the Councillor of any impacted ward in order to be changed.

No specific rate increases are being recommended at this time, however, a review of the rates is underway and there may be a need to increase the rates at the \$3.54 per hour locations prior to the 2017 Budget Process.

Any comments received after the Committee meetings will be forwarded to City Council.

The Budget Committee will make its final recommendations on November 24, 2015, which will be forwarded for consideration by the Executive Committee at its meeting on December 1, 2015 and then to City Council at its meeting on December 9 and 10, 2015.

The adopted fees will be implemented through a by-law that will amend the Municipal Code, if necessary.

While the 2016 Toronto Parking Authority Recommended Operating Budget recommends an adjustment to the maximum rate from \$3.54 to \$4.43, the appropriate Committee may change this recommendation and Toronto City Council may adopt rates that differ from the recommendation, including rates that are higher or lower, and may adopt new rates.
