The event must not be advertised to the public (for example: by way of fivers, newspaper, internet or radio). There can be no intent to gain or profit from the sale of alcohol at the event.

Public events conducted by registered charities and non-profit organizations / associations may accept alcohol donated by manufacturers of alcohol. Receipts for all donated product must be made available.

Laft over alcohol must be removed from the premises at the end of the event. When returning unopened elcohol purchased from a government store, you must produce the permit and a copy of the receipt(s). Check with the retailer at which you purchased the alcohol for further details.

Any SOP holder may be issued a monetary penalty as a result of specific breaches of the Liquor Licence Act and Regulations. The appount of the monetary panalty will be based on the approved Schedule of Monetary Panalties which can be found on the AGCO websits.
