The Ministry has reviewed the applications. In accordance with the requirements under the Ministry's *Public Transportation and Highway Improvement Act* we provide the following comments:

This land is within the Ministry of Transportation's permit control area and future development of these lands will require Ministry review and approval. The owner / applicant will require an MTO Building & Land Use Permit for any development, entrance, change of entrance use, building or structure within 45 metres of the provincial highway property line or within 395 metres of the centre point of an intersection or interchange with a provincial highway. In addition, construction on these lands must not commence prior to the issuance of the necessary MTO permits.

Any proposed structures (above or below ground) or amenities which are essential to the viability of the site (e.g. utilities, frontage roads, fire routes, parking, stormwater management ponds) must be set back a minimum of 14 metres from the highway property line.

MTO Sign permits are required for any signs which are visible from Highway 401 and within 400 metres of the highway property line. This requirement includes alterations or location changes of existing signage.
