- Purpose of the Waste Strategy
 - Limited landfill capacity
 - Guide decision making for the next 30 to 50 years
 - Council Strategic Action
- Guiding Principles for the development of the Waste Strategy:
 - Consideration of options which support waste hierarchy
 - Consideration of all other environmentally approved disposal options to extend Landfill life
 - Open & transparent review of the options
 - Innovation / flexibility for emerging technologies & regulatory changes
 - Support policies & opportunities for collaboration



Development of draft Evaluation Criteria

- Follow Triple Bottom Line Approach: Environmental, Social, Economic considerations
- Indicators may differ depending on type of option it is being applied to (Programmatic vs. Facility)













Development of Preliminary Options

- Will address the identified gaps and challenges
- Developed through multi-faceted approach
- 2 categories: programmatic, facility/infrastructure

Programmatic Example	Facility/Infrastructure Example
Promotion & Education	Collection & Drop-off
Reduce & Reuse Programs	Energy from Waste
Recycling	Landfill
