Re: A Road Safety Plan for Toronto
Request to Chair Jaye Robinson

Dear Mrs. Robinson:

We note from the your Minutes of February 23, 2015 that the Committee has adopted a motion to request City Council to direct the General Manager, Transportation Services to report in the fourth quarter of 2015 with a comprehensive plan to improve road safety.

The Committee requests that the plan include "specific recommendations to improve road safety, particularly for pedestrians and cyclists, over the short, medium and long terms", and that a Road Safety Advisory Group, including external stakeholders be created.

We have ongoing interests and concerns about the safety issues involving motorcyclists in the City of Toronto and respectfully request that the plan address those concerns together with those involving pedestrians and cyclists.

As well, we would be pleased to appoint a representative to serve as a member of the advisory group, should you so desire.

The Canadian Motorcycle Association, as Canada's representative to the world governing body, Federation International de Motocyclisme, has access to safety studies undertaken by the FIM as well as those of other member federations throughout the world. We feel this could be of benefit to the advisory group.

We would appreciate hearing from you if the agenda of your next meeting could include our requests.
